## From the Heart of the District Superintendent

### The Declarations of God

"Remember the former things of old: for I am God, and there is none else; I am God, and there is none like me, Declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure: Calling a ravenous bird from the east, the man that executeth my counsel from a far country: yea, I have spoken it, I will also bring also do it." Isaiah gave this

it to pass; I have purposed it, I will also do it." Isaiah gave this message to the children of Israel in chapter 46:9-11.

Consider some of the things the Lord declares in His Word which He would have us to continue in the New Year.

1) He is declaring that His people must be a people of prayer. Prayer has been and still is the means by which we move the hand of God. Paul tells us we must, "Pray without ceasing." Martin Luther said, "To be a Christian without prayer is no more possible than to be alive without breathing." In Philippians 4:6 (Amplified Bible), Paul wrote, "Do not fret or have any anxiety about anything, but in every circumstance and in everything, by prayer and petition (definite requests), with thanksgiving, continue to make your wants known to God." John Wesley so appropriately said, "God does nothing except in response to believing prayer!" R. A. Torey wrote, "If we would feed the fire of our prayers with the fuel of God's Word, all our difficulties in prayer would disappear." We must be people of prayer.

2) God declares, we must be people of faith. Paul declared to the Romans, 10:17 (Amplified Bible), "So faith comes by hearing (what is told), and what is heard comes by the preaching (of the message that came from the lips) of Christ (the Messiah Himself)." Paul also wrote to the Hebrew believers in 11:6 (Amplified Bible), "But without faith it is impossible to please and be satisfactory to Him. For whoever would come near to God must (necessarily) believe that God exists and that He is the rewarder of those who earnestly and diligently seek Him (out)." The kind of faith which pleases God is one that trust even though there is no sign of an answer. As 11:1 (Amplified Bible) of Hebrews records, "Now faith is the assurance (the confirmation, the title deed) of the things (we) hope for, being the proof of things (we) do not see and the conviction of their reality (faith perceiving as real fact what is not revealed to the senses)." Paul records a testament to Abraham's faith in Romans 4:20-21 (Amplified Bible), "No unbelief or distrust made him waver (doubtingly question) concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong and was empowered by faith as he gave praise and glory to God, Fully satisfied and assured that God was able and mighty to keep His word and to do what He had promised." During this New Year may our faith sustain us as we continue our God given assignments. We must be people of faith.

3) We must be people of the Spirit. As Jesus said, now that

the Spirit has been given, He is glorified of the Father and the Holy Spirit guides us into all truth and will show us things to come, (John 16:13). As people of the Spirit we have the opportunity to not only live in the Spirit but also to walk in the Spirit, (Galatians 5:25). Thus the Amplified Bible reads this way, "If by the Holy Spirit we have our life in God, let us go forward walking in line, our conduct controlled by the Spirit." The life which is controlled by the Holy Spirit will be one that brings glory to God. We must be people of the Spirit.

4) God declares, we must be people of compassion. One of the Fundamental Truths of our fellowship is to be a people who demonstrate God's love and compassion for all the world. James, the half-brother of Jesus wrote in 1:17, "Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world." Paul also wrote, "Only they would that we should remember the poor; the same which I also was forward to do" (Galatians 2:10). This must include more than just giving a helping hand to meet a physical need, it must include a love for every lost person! We must be people of compassion.

5) We must be people of expectancy. We live with the expectancy that Jesus' return could occur at any moment. This is the imminent and blessed hope of the church. Recently, while teaching on the subject of the imminent return of Christ, the question was asked, "What about Jesus' words in Matthew 24:14?" "And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come." In that moment, I sensed the Spirit say to me, "There could be a period of time between the fulfillment of the first part of the verse and the last part." Since not all of scripture is laid out in moment by moment chronological order. Therefore, it is important to live with the expectancy of Christ's return at any moment and with the purpose of helping to spread the gospel in all the world for a witness.

### The Two-Percent Advance: Lessons From the Tale of Nail Soup, Exodus 35:1-35

lore?" the answer is found in a common thread which runs through this tale, as well as the Two-Percent Advance Ministry of the West Texas District. (Some of the information in this piece is a reprint of the article I wrote for the March 2011 Tidings.)

In the Tale of Nail Soup some accounts tell of a single traveler stumbling into town trying to find food and lodging for the night from a miserly widow or widower, while others tell of three monks or soldiers asking for assistance from any and all the citizens of the community. The jest of both tell of the influence and persuasion used to generate participation for a common good. After being refused help from the people of the town, the traveler was able to secure a large soup pot, fill it with water and station it above a blazing fire. As the water heated, the tramp attentively circled the fire while clutching a large nail in his hand. Soon thereafter, people of the town begin to gather near to learn what might be cooking in the pot, to which the stranger replied, "nail soup," as he displayed the main ingredient to his growing audience. "Leave it to me," he said. "I've learned things on my travels that most people have never heard." As the growing crowd watched in awe, the newcomer dropped the nail into the hot water while commencing to tell that his soup had been eaten by kings and queens. As he slowly stirred the pot he announced, "I've been making soup with this same nail for over a week so our soup may be rather thin. Of course, if one had a speck of flour or sifted oatmeal to add to it, then we could be sure of a good meal." No sooner was his words spoken than someone said, "Wait, I might have some flour somewhere," rushing off and returning with the finest sort. After sprinkling the flour into the pot he wishfully said, "It's coming along! It's almost good enough to serve to company. If only we had some potatoes and a bit of salted beef, it would be a dish fit for gentlefolks." Immediately some in the crowd rushed to their homes and returned with the requested ingredients. As he continued to stir the soup he remarked, "This will be a grand soup. It's not everyone that gets to taste such delicious soup as this!" Someone was heard to say, "You don't say! And just imagine . . . all from a nail!" By now the atmosphere of the people had changed from cynicism to anticipation. "All it lacks now is a little barley, some milk, a few carrots, onions, celery, salt and pepper. Then we could invite the dignitaries to join us, if we so please," said the tramp. Within moments more than enough of each was brought and added to the mixture as the aroma of the pot filled the air. During the final few minutes the tramp continued to stir, stopping only long enough to remove the nail for the steaming kettle. "It's ready," he said. "Now we can feast, just like kings and queens, except, of course, when they eat this kind of soup, they always have a sandwich with it, and something cold and soothing to drink, along with tablecloths on the tables." That evening the beggar and the town folks dined sumptiously on steaming bowls of nail soup, accompanied with cheese, butter, smoked beef, veal and the best of beverages. The tables could hardly hold it all. Never in the town's history had there been such merriment and to think that it was all from a nail! The next morning as the traveler prepared to leave town the people showered him with food and a silver piece to help him on to his next destination. Two-Percent - not much by some standards, yet a great blessing to our district over the years. Back during the early-to-middle 80s, the 2% Advance Program was introduced to West Texas pastors and churches through the ministry of Rev. Richard Dortch, who served at the time as the Superintendent of the Illinois district. Shortly after his ministry in our district, the voting body at District Council passed a resolution to recommend that each church in our district give two-percent of their undesignated funds to support the district. Originally, those contributions went to the tithe fund, however, in later years the pastors and church delegates voted for half of the two-percent to be equally divided between three district departments (Christian Education, Women's Ministries, and Men's Ministries)." It was further pointed out that in 2010, the year prior to the article being written, thirty-two churches participated in the 2% Advance Program, giving \$45,045.67. With fifty-percent of that total being divided between the three designated ministries, each received \$7,507.60 for the year, averaging \$625.63 a month. That amount by no means fully funds these departments, however, it makes a significant difference in their month-to-month operation. If we fast forward to 2022, the books show from January 1 to December 14, \$28,884.72 has been given from fifteen churches, down significantly from previous years. Twenty-five churches gave \$40,381.73 in 2019, while twenty-two churches gave \$35,947.85 in 2020. In 2021 seventeen churches contributed \$30,522.05. Two-percent is not much compared to the giving of some, however, only eternity will reveal the lives that were touched and the progress that was made by the power of little! It's reported that an English nobleman just before his death said, "What I spent, I had. What I kept, I lost. What I gave, I

> Exodus 35 is the record of God instructing Moses to direct the people of Israel to bring "a sacred offering to the Lord" (NLT), for the building of the wilderness Tabernacle. "Let those with generous hearts present the following gifts to the LORD" (Exodus 35:5b NLT). The directive that follows calls for some to bring gold, while others were to bring silver, and some bronze. Blue, purple, scarlet, fine linen, goats' hair, rams' skins tanned red, acacia wood, oil for the light, spices for anointing oil and for fragrant incense, onyx stones and other stones to be set for the ephod and the breastplate, were the ingredients on the divine menu for this holy edifice. "And they came, each one whose heart stirred him up and whose spirit made him willing, and brought the Lord's offering to be used for the (new) Tent of Meeting, for all its service, and the holy garments (Exodus 35:21 Amplified Bible). ### **2% Advance Program**

The 2% Advance Program is a method by which the churches of the West Texas District can support the district. This program is a vital link in the support of the ministries made available through the district office. It is recommended that each church send at least 2% of their regular tithes and offerings (undesignated funds) to the district. This excludes any designated offerings such as offerings for evangelist, missionaries, building projects, etc. One-half of the amount designated as 2% Advance is divided equally among the Christian Education, Men's Ministries and Women's Ministries funds.

Consider for a moment the benefits that our local churches receive by being affiliated with the Assemblies of God. The local church receives an opportunity for fellowship, advice, and encouragement through the district officiary. There are also benefits of being able to call upon the district to assist in securing a pastor, have a solid Biblical standard for membership, a resource concerning legal matters and receive reports of the advancement of the Kingdom across the district as well as around the world. The local church has the privilege of cooperating in joint efforts such as Youth, Men's and Women's Ministries, and missionary endeavors both home and abroad. Through cooperative support the local church has part ownership in Southwestern Assemblies of God University and Pleasant Hills Children's Home.

For many years, Psalm 133:1, "Behold how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!" has been the guiding scripture for our district work. What a great work can be accomplished as all the local churches in the district join together to further the cause of the gospel of Jesus Christ.



### Announcing New App: Forecasts of Life & Events

"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world" (John 16:33 NIV).

We live in a society that has an app for everything. I will admit that I like my apps. There are many of them that cause convenience for life. The apps for drinks are great for the fact that you can earn points towards free drinks. I like being "rewarded" for spending. Wouldn't it be great to download an app that would forecast upcoming changes in life; difficulties that will be blowing in; or God's calling moving us in our job or location or both? What if the app extended further into forecasting for weeks ahead; months ahead; or even years ahead? If we knew the future, would we be more cautious in our decisions? Would it change our choices? Or would it just be nice to know what is ahead?

In the movie "Indiana Jones and The Last Crusade" Indiana faces a giant chasm. There's no way he could ever come close to jumping across, and he eventually realizes that it's a leap of faith. Indiana takes a giant step off the edge and Boom! There's an invisible bridge. He slowly walks across where he needs to be. Each day of life brings a new challenge. Our relationship with God and our faithfulness to His word and prayer will get us through whatever comes our way. I don't like surprises; or unexpected changes; or life blindsiding me. There is no forecast that I can tune in to. There is no app to download to give me warning or preparation of anything that would come against my routine or plans. There are a few things I like to remember in whatever lies ahead that is unplanned or unexpected.

- 1) Uncertainty: There are many moments of uncertainty that arise in both good and bad situations. There is the moment when you open your completed income tax return, from the accountant, only to be put into a moment of shock at what the form says that you still owe after paying throughout the year. Or what you thought was a routine doctor's appointment turns into a life changing diagnosis. Or in your moment of contentment where God has you, He leads you elsewhere and the physical/financial aspects of it just does not seem possible. This is where faith comes in. We must also remember the faithfulness of God. "When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze" (Isaiah 43:2 NIV).
- 2) Undetermined Outcome: Each storm; speed bump; accomplishment; acclamation; or sorrow will have a different ending. Yet, there is one thing for sure. You will come out stronger; more mature in wisdom; and better off than if you had known about the future and avoided things altogether. "God blesses those who patiently endure testing and temptation. Afterward they will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him" (James 1:12 NLT).
- 3) Undeniable Faithfulness: In everything that we may go through or experience, one thing is for sure, God is faithful. He will remain by our side through the good times and the bad times. All we need to do is obey Him; remain faithful to His word; and keep in constant communication with Him through prayer. Be faithful to obey His commands and leading. We are not expected to sit in the middle of the storm and not move. We can't go around the storms. But we can march right through the storms with God by our side. Jesus is near for me to call on Him in the storm. When He calls to a different ministry post, He is already paving the way if we will just obey. I think of Jesus in the boat with the disciples. A storm arises and there is Jesus, fast asleep. Though the disciples see someone sleeping and seeming to not care about the storm; or the boat being tossed about; or about the disciples' safety, one might think that Jesus had peace in the storm. He was at peace to a point that He could rest. "Your faithfulness endures to all generations; You established the earth, and it abides" (Psalm 119:90 NKJV).

There are no apps to download for help seeing what's ahead. But we can be reassured that God is faithful to walk with us through the good, the bad and the ugly. If God calls us to make changes, we know, by faith, we can take the first step even though I might not know the next step like Indiana Jones. When the storm clouds arise, we can be assured that God is still the Master of the wind.






