An Easter Faith In A Good Friday World

According to John 16:33, Jesus recognized that we live in “**A GOOD FRIDAY WORLD!**” “These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.” He also wants us to recognize that we can still have “**AN EASTER FAITH!**” The Amplified Bible records His words this way: “In the world you have tribulation and trials and distress and frustration; but be of good cheer [take courage; be confident, certain, undaunted]! For I have overcome the world. [I have deprived it of power to harm you and have conquered it for you.]” People face many of these things in our world today because we live in a “**GOOD FRIDAY WORLD!**” But let me remind you that we have **HOPE in Jesus!**

All four Gospel writers record the events around the resurrection of Christ. Biblical scholars say that for the first 400 years of Christianity there was more preaching about the resurrection than there was about the cross. Could it be the early Christians needed to understand the stone was not rolled away from the tomb to let Jesus out but rather to let the world in to confirm the resurrection? We may live in a **GOOD FRIDAY WORLD** but we can **HAVE AN EASTER FAITH!**

Some of my remarks come from an article written by Michael Horban in the Pentecostal Evangel April 7, 1996. First of all let’s consider, **The Position of the Resurrected Christ.** Jesus is no longer hanging on the cross or laying in the borrowed tomb of Joseph of Arimathea or forever held by death.

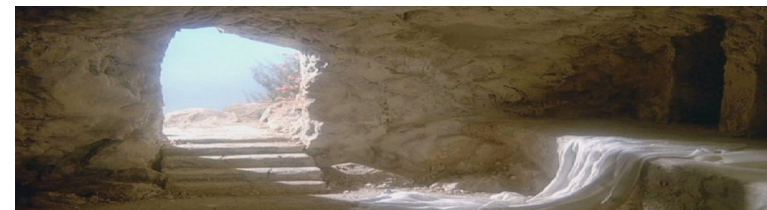
The writer of Hebrews 1:3 states, “Christ is seated at the right hand of the majesty on high.” Also, Paul wrote to the church in Rome in 8:34 “...it is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again who is even at the right hand of God...” His position is one of exultation, and as Revelations 5:11-12 declares, “Then I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels around the throne and [the voice] of the living creatures and the elders; and they numbered myriads of myriads, and thousands of thousands (innumerable), saying in a loud voice, ‘Worthy and deserving is the Lamb that was sacrificed to receive power and riches and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing.’”

Second, let’s consider **THE POWER OF THE RESURRECTED CHRIST.** Jesus stated and Matthew recorded His words in 28:18, “All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.” The power of the resurrected Christ will save all who will believe on Him. Hebrews 7:25a states, “Wherefore He is able also to save them to the uttermost that come to God by Him...” Christ has the power to forgive sin, cleanse from sin and keep us from sin. He also has given us power through the baptism in the Holy Spirit. John the Baptist said and Luke 3:16 records it, “I indeed baptize you with water, but one mightier than I cometh, the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to unloose; He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and with fire.” The power of the resurrected Christ makes way for the Holy Spirit to be our continual Comforter, Counselor, Helper and Standby. The power of the resurrected Christ will not only provide for us, He is ever interceding for us. Hebrews 7:25b, “...seeing He ever liveth to make intercession for them.” Paul wrote it this way to the church in Rome chapter 8 verse 34, “Who is He that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who maketh intercession for us.” This is why we can “Come boldly unto the throne of grace and obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need” Hebrews 4:16. One final aspect of the power of the resurrected Christ is that He has power over sin and death. Colossians 2:15 (Amplified), “[God] disarmed the principalities and powers against us and made a bold display and public example of them, in triumphing over them in Him and in it [the cross].” Michael Horban wrote, “Jesus had raised the dead, restored sight to the blind, made the lame to walk, cleansed the lepers and cured the sick of all manner of diseases. Despite all these signs the religious leaders of His day clamored for more. To settle the matter once and for all, Jesus told them His ultimate sign was till coming - the sign of the prophet Jonah. Jonah had been inside a big fish for 3 days and 3 nights, but emerged alive. Jesus said, “So shall the son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.” Matthew 12:40. Jesus physical resurrection from the dead is not theology; it is history. The resurrection sets Jesus apart from all other earthly religious teachers. Buddha is dead; Confucius is dead; Mohammed is dead. JESUS and JESUS alone has returned from the grave. And that means that the last miserable enemy - DEATH - has been vanquished.” This brings to light Paul’s words in 1 Corinthians 15:54-55, “...Death is swallowed up in victory! O Death, where is thy sting? O Grave, where is thy victory?” The **POWER OF THE RESURRECTION** has given us the Victory!

Third, consider **OUR POSITION IN THE RESURRECTED CHRIST.** As we consider our position in the resurrected Christ remember, we are hid in Christ, Colossians 3:3, “For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God.” We will appear in glory with Christ, Colossians 3:4, “When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with Him in glory.” We are made alive in Christ, Ephesians 2:1, [Amplified] “And you [He made alive when you] were [spiritually] dead and separated from Him because of your transgressions and sins.” And one final aspect of our position in the resurrected Christ is, we are made to sit with Christ in heavenly places, Ephesians 2:6-7, [Amplified] “And He raised us up together with Him [when we believed], and seated us with Him in the heavenly places, [because we are] in Christ Jesus, [and He did this] so that in the ages to come He might [clearly] show the immeasurable and unsurpassed riches of His grace in [His] kindness toward us in Christ Jesus [by providing for our redemption].”

As we celebrate this Easter season, let’s keep in mind, The **POSITION** of the resurrected Christ; The **POWER** of the resurrected Christ; and **OUR POSITION** in the resurrected Christ!

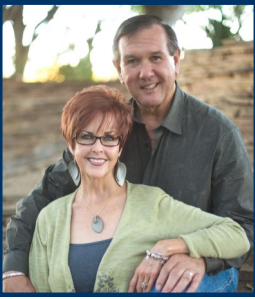

The Risen Christ, 1 Corinthians 15:1-28

Paul's first letter to the church in Corinth deals with a number of issues that were affecting the health of the local body. Corinth was a wild and wooly cosmopolitan area known for its idolatry and immorality. The humanistic thinking of the city had made inroads into the church and created issues that could only be solved through spiritual oversight. The tone of Paul's letter changes near the completion of this epistle when the apostle devotes the fifteenth chapter to the resurrection of Jesus and the subsequent resurrection of those who die in the faith. Keep in mind, the doctrine of the resurrection was totally foreign to Greek thought. In fact, there existed no technical words in Greek to describe it until Jesus rose from the dead, an event that became the cornerstone of the Church! Easter is a most special day of joy and celebration around the world, deemed a most significant Christian holy day. At this occasion, we remember not only the great sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, we also rejoice in His triumph over the power of sin and death, enabling us to have eternal life. As early American clergyman Phillips Brooks accurately noted, speaking of Easter, "Let every man and woman count himself immortal. Let him catch the revelation of Jesus in His resurrection. Let him say not merely, 'Christ is risen,' but 'I shall rise.'" In this chapter, Paul first establishes the resurrection of Jesus as a historic fact in verses 1-11. He then shows that the Christian faith is centered on the resurrection of Christ in verses 12-18 and ties those things to the culmination of God's plan to establish His rule through Christ over all things in verses 19-29. How blessed to know the truth of Alfred H. Ackley's hymn, *He Lives!* "I serve a risen Savior, He's in the world today. I know that He is living whatever men may say; I see His hand of mercy, I hear His voice of cheer, and just the time I need Him He's always near. He lives, He lives, Christ Jesus lives today, He walks with me and talks with me along life's narrow way. He lives, He lives, salvation to impart; you ask me how I know He lives, He lives within my heart." Stanley E. Jones wrote in his devotional, *Abundant Living*, "The early church did not say in dismay, 'Look what the world has come to,' but in delight, 'Look what has come to the world!'" Here are three biblical truths every believer can stand on as we celebrate the resurrection of our Savior on Easter and every day of the year.

The Proclamation of the Resurrection. The announcement that Jesus would come forth from the dead had been clearly and publically articulated before He was arrested by the Roman soldiers or sentenced to death by Pilate. John records Jesus entering the Temple in Jerusalem early in His ministry and cleansing it of the egregious money changers who were taking advantage of those who had come to The Feast Of Passover. If the people brought their own sacrifice to the Temple for this religious festival the greedy priests would declare it unfit and require them to buy one of theirs that was outrageously priced. However, before they could buy an "acceptable" sacrifice from the Temple stable, many of the people had to exchange their money into the local currency. To do so, they were charged excessively by the same covetous priests. This was why Jesus turned over the tables and labeled the money changers "thieves," provoking the Jews to ask for a sign from him to vouch for His authority to take such measures. Jesus' answer was, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:19 KJV). When Peter preached on the Day of Pentecost, he indicted the attentive crowd for crucifying Jesus. He then went on to say, "Whom God hath raised up, having loosed the pains of death..." (Acts 2:24a KJV). As someone has appropriately stated, "The good news is the bad news is wrong." Two-thousand years later the *proclamation* of His victory over hell and the grave continues to be the hope of the world! Robert Louis Stevenson, the great Scottish author who wrote *Treasure Island*, was accustomed to bed-ridden illness. Although frequently ill, he remained eternally optimistic. One day, his wife approached him after a terrible coughing spell and remarked, "I expect you still believe it's a wonderful day?" Stevenson confidently replied, "I do. I will never permit a row of medicine bottles to block my horizon." We can focus on the medicine bottles, the bills, the disappointments of life, the conflicts and the hardship, or we can keep our sights set on the *proclamation* of the angels, "He is not here. He is alive."

The Proof of the Resurrection. Paul devotes a number of verses in this text as solid evidence of Jesus' resurrection: "I passed on to you what was most important and what had also been passed on to me. Christ died for our sins, just as the Scriptures said. He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, just as the Scriptures said. He was seen by Peter and then by the Twelve. After that, he was seen by more than 500 of his followers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he was seen by James and later by all the apostles. Last of all, as though I had been born at the wrong time, I also say him." (1 Corinthians 15:3-8 NLT). History proves Jesus Christ did in fact live, was crucified, died, and then rose again! The evidence is beyond debate! How do you explain the large and heavy stone that covered the entrance to the tomb being removed while being guarded by Roman soldiers? Give a logical answer for the unwrapped grave clothes left in the sepulcher looking like a cocoon - as if the body they once encased evaporated. Why the bribery of the Roman guards to lie, the empty tomb, and the many appearances of Jesus to His followers after His resurrection? Years ago a woman wrote the well-known radio preacher, J. Vernon McGee. Her letter said the following: "Our preacher said that on Easter Jesus just swooned on the Cross and that the disciples nursed him back to health. What do you think?" J. Vernon McGee replied, "Dear Sister, beat your preacher with a leather whip for thirty-nine heavy strokes. Nail him to a cross. Hang him in the sun for six hours. Run a spear through his heart. Embalm Him. Put Him in an airless tomb for three days. Then see what happens." Thank God! We have the *proclamation* and the *proof* of the resurrection!

The provision of the Resurrection. I read that in the early days of the automobile a man's Model-T Ford stalled in the middle of the road. He couldn't get it started no matter how hard he cranked nor how much he tried to advance the spark or adjust things under the hood. Just then a chauffeured limousine pulled up behind him and a wiry, energetic man stepped out from the back seat and offered his assistance. After tinkering for a few moments, the stranger said, "Now try it!" Immediately the engine leaped to life. The well-dressed individual then identified himself as Henry Ford. "I designed and built these cars," he said, "so I know what to do when something goes wrong." We serve the God who created and put into place all we have and all we are, and He is able to fix any and everything in our lives that's been broken by sin! We have provision because of the resurrection! In the 18th century, the U.S. Congress issued a special edition of Thomas Jefferson's Bible, otherwise known as, *The Life and Morals of Jesus of Nazareth*. You may know that Jefferson excised all references to the supernatural out of his Bible so that his Bible simply contained the moral teachings of Jesus. The closing words of his Bible were, "There laid they Jesus and rolled a great stone at the mouth of the sepulcher and departed." The resurrection is not a myth! The Savior promised it, the Spirit proved it, and the saints proclaimed it! John S. Whale said, "The gospels do not explain the resurrection; the resurrection explains the gospels. Belief in the resurrection is not an appendage to the Christian faith; it is the Christian faith."

Psalm 23 And The Names Of God

David wrote this Psalm to describe the ways the Lord restores, guides, leads and comforts. David was a shepherd long before he was a king; therefore, he was well acquainted with what the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep under his care looked like. This Psalm reflects the nine covenant names of God.

JEHOVAH-ROHI: The Lord is My Shepherd (Vs. 1a) - David uses the personal pronoun "my" to talk about his relationship to the Shepherd. He did not say, "The Lord is a Shepherd." He did not say, "The Lord is the Shepherd." He said, "The Lord is my Shepherd."

JEHOVAH-JIREH: The Lord is My Provider - "I shall not want" (Vs. 1b). The Shepherd provides for every need. No lack is experienced. God not only sees our needs, but He also provides. The Apostle Paul affirmed this in **Philippians 4:19** when he said, "And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." Later, David proclaims, "My cup runs over" (Vs. 5b). He is the God of more than enough!

JEHOVAH-SHALOAM: The Lord is My Peace - "He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters" (Vs. 2). Hungry, fearful, or agitated sheep will not lie down, which means that the shepherd must bring them to a place of quiet. Sheep will not drink from a running stream. They are not designed for swimming because of their heavy wool. The Shepherd looks for a gentle, flowing stream for refreshment because running water makes them skittish.

JEHOVAH-RAPHI: The Lord is My Healer - "He restores my soul" (Vs. 3a). The word "restore" means to bring back to life. The Prophet Isaiah stated, "But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement of our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5). Wounds are something that you can see, such as a cut. Wounds can represent physical healing. A bruise is something that is deep under the skin, and it cannot always be seen. Bruises can represent inner healing: emotional, mental, and spiritual.

JEHOVAH-TISIDKENU: The Lord is My Righteousness - "He leads me in paths of righteousness" (Vs. 3b). God will always lead us down a path that causes us to orbit Him. God is going to lead us on the right path. It is a straight path. **Psalm 27:11** declares, "Teach me Your way, O Lord; lead me in a straight path."

JEHOVAH-SHAMMAH: The Lord is Present - "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me" (Vs. 4). David is not just talking about death, but any dark place we might find ourselves in. A dark valley could be financial, medical, relational, or spiritual. The greatest comfort to fearful sheep was to be in the presence of their shepherd. The Bible states that He will never leave us, nor forsake us.

JEHOVAH-NISSI: The Lord is My Banner - "You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies" (Vs. 5). The word "mesa" in Spanish means "table." This verse is talking about a plateau, or a grassy hillside in which sheep could graze without fear of attack from predators.

JEHOVAH-M'KADDESH: The Lord is My Sanctifier - "You anoint my head with oil" (Vs. 5b). In the Bible, oil is a picture of the Holy Spirit who provides power, protection, and preservation.

JEHOVAH-ELELYON: The Lord Most High - "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life" (Vs. 6a). Throughout the Psalm, David has portrayed the Shepherd as always being in front of His flock. You drive cattle, but you lead sheep. God is leading us, and He has two sheepdogs coming up behind us to offer protection. They are called "Goodness and Mercy." The child of God never has to worry about what's behind them, and they don't have to worry about the future. David declared, "And I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever" (Vs. 6b). Our future home is a Promise, a Place, but most of all, it is a Person. One day, Jesus Christ, the Great Shepherd, will gather all His sheep together and take them to their eternal home.

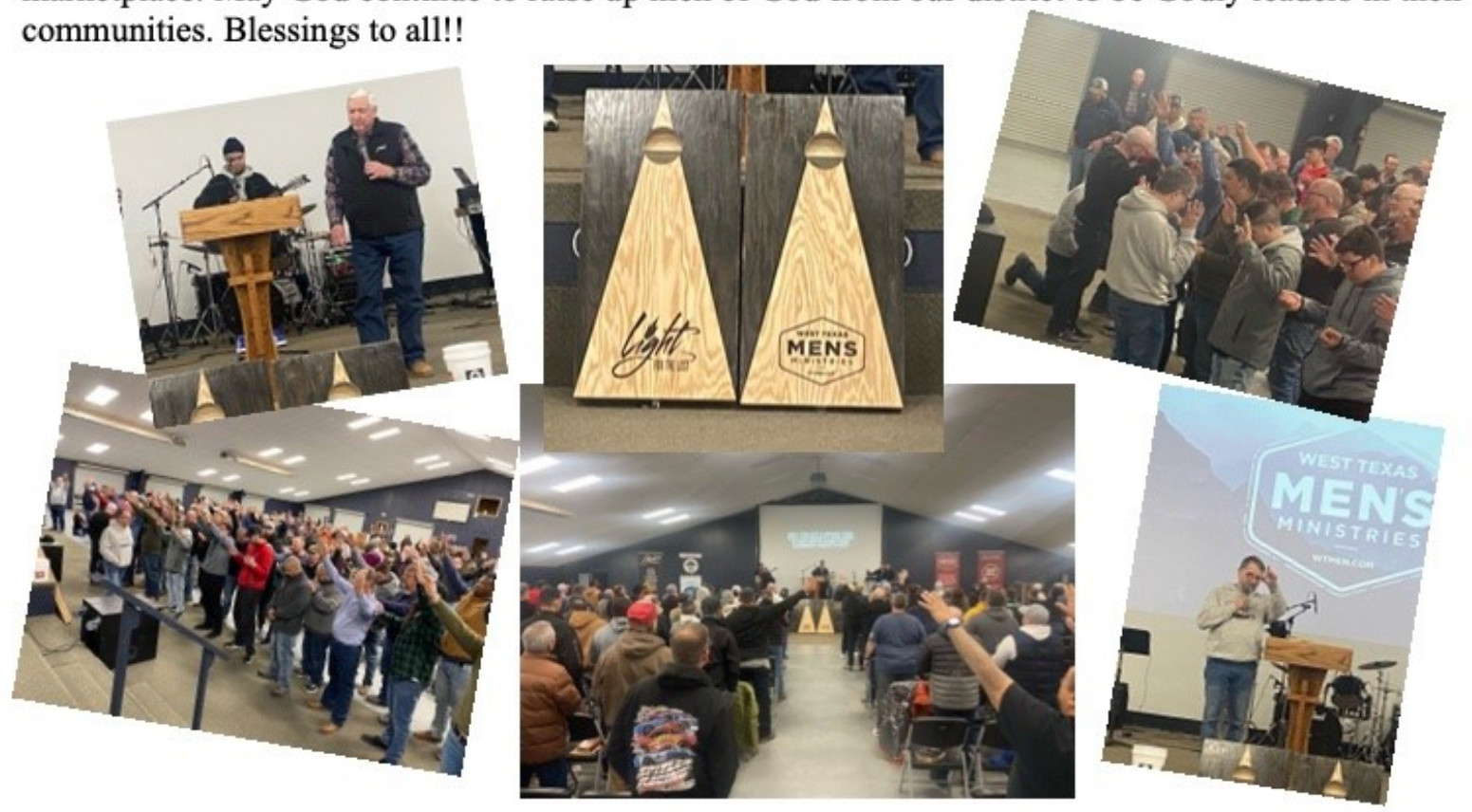

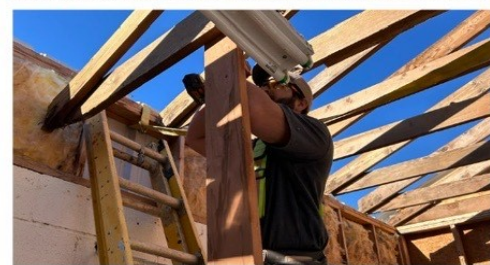


RSC March Updates
