

The Profile Of A Great Man: Part 1, Acts 4:32-37

With Father's Day and National Men's Ministries Day in the Assemblies of God being June 16, it is appropriate to place the spotlight of appreciation upon the men of our fellowship, as well as challenge each man to rise and rally to the occasion. Never has there been more confusion regarding the role of men in society, nor a greater assault against masculinity than what has been witnessed over the past decades. From the media to the military, men are being told they no longer qualify as leaders of the home or the nation. Biological men are now forcing themselves into women's sports, masquerading as women while being applauded by the largest labor union in the United States, the National Education Association, the White House, Hollywood and a growing segment of the culture. The feminism of the 1960s to the 1980s was supposedly to achieve equal rights, while the thinking of those in the twenty-first century advocate the dominance of women at all cost. The rest of the story is a glaring contrast! God has an army of men who know their role in the home, the church and the nation and they understand their Godgiven assignment cannot be substituted or filled by two mommies. They are part of the fellowship of the unashamed. The dye has been cast, they have stepped over the line and the decision has been made to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. They will not look back, let up, slow down, back away or be still. These are great men! Though their name will never be in lights, nor will they make Forbes' 500 List of the world's richest, their face is set, their goal is heaven, their mission clear and their Guide reliable!

Acts 4 gives part of the biblical record of one of the **great** men of the New Testament and perhaps of all Scripture. He is known as Joseph the Levite from Cyprus and he qualifies as one of the finest men mentioned in the Holy Writ. He is called "a good man" by Luke, the writer of Acts. **Good** is defined by Mr. Webster as, "having the required qualities of a high standard, morally right, virtuous, righteous, well behaved" while the Greek rendering means, "**benevolent, profitable, useful, upright, virtuous**." Luke gives further insight into the life of this **great** man, "But there were some of them, men of Cyprus and Cyrene, who on returning to Antioch spoke to the Greeks also, proclaiming [to them] the good news (the Gospel) about the Lord Jesus. And the presence of the Lord was with them with power, so that a great number [learned] to believe (to adhere to and trust in and rely on the Lord) and turned and surrendered themselves to Him. The rumors of this came to the ears of the church (assembly) in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. When he arrived and saw what grace (favor) God was bestowing upon them, he was full of joy; and he continuously exhorted (warned, urged, and encouraged) them all to cleave unto and remain faithful to and devoted to the Lord with [resolute and steady] purpose of heart. For he was a good man [good in himself and also at once for the good and the advantage of other people], full of and controlled by the Holy Spirit and full of faith (of his belief that Jesus is the Messiah, through Whom we obtain eternal salvation). And a large company was added to the Lord" (Acts 11:20-24 Amplified).

Joseph the Levite was also called Barnabas, and that name is used twenty-eight times in the New Testament. Our text says in verse 36 that Barnabas was Joseph's surname. Today we would call it a nickname, an added name derived from one's occupation or other circumstances. We know from Scripture that James and John, two of Jesus' disciples, were known as, "sons of thunder". The Old Testament prophet, Jeremiah, is remembered as being, "the weeping prophet." Luke informs that Joseph the Levite was known by that title in Cyprus. Upon arriving in Jerusalem he was initially known as the same until he was given another name by the apostles who saw a pattern of conduct in his everyday life. He didn't have to tell them, "You can call me Barnabas if you'd like because I'm Mr. Encouragement!" No, he did as Proverbs directs, "Let another man praise you, and not your own mouth; a stranger, and not your own lips" (Proverbs 27:2 Amplified).

We too are being given names/labels by those who watch our conduct. What name describes my life? What adjective(s) are associated with your life and ministry? If I do not like what I see when I examine myself through the eyes of God's Word, there's an excellent example given in Scripture who models **The Profile of a Great Man!** His name is Barnabas. Before we look at the qualities that exemplify **great**, it would be well for us to take a brief look at the background of this unsung hero. We learn from Scripture that he was a Levite and he owned land, something not common for Levites. The law of Moses states, "Remember that the Levitical priests—that is, the whole of the tribe of Levi—will receive no allotment of land among the other tribes in Israel. Instead, the priests and Levites will eat from the special gifts given to the LORD, for that is their share. They will have no land of their own among the Israelites. The LORD himself is their special possession, just as he promised them" (Deuteronomy 18:1-2 NLT). The land he owned was not in Israel because he was born of Jewish parents outside of Palestine, in Cypress, an island in the northeastern Mediterranean Sea, 50 miles south of Turkey (Asia Minor), 70 miles west of Syria. Some believe he may have come to Jerusalem because of his priestly connections, by virtue of being a Levite. We know he became part of the early Christian community in Jerusalem, and when he joined with the believers there he was known as Joseph. Other noteworthy matters are, he soon became a leader and a man of distinction in the church. He and John Mark, the writer of the second gospel, were cousins, according to Colossians 4:10. (Some say uncle/nephew). His name stands first on the list of prophets and teachers of the church at Antioch. "Among the prophets and teachers of the church at Antioch of Syria were Barnabas, Simeon (called "the black man"), Lucius (from Cyrene), Manaen (the childhood companion of King Herod Antipas), and Saul" (Acts 13:1 NLT). If those five names are listed in the order of prominence, as is often the case, take note of which name is mentioned first, and which name is last. The man who many would call "the greatest man in the New Testament, Saul/Paul," is named last! In the limited space that remains I will attempt to do justice to the first of three things that made Barnabas one of the greatest men in the New Testament.

BARNABAS WAS A SELFLESS MAN. This truth emerges early in Luke's history of the early church. "The whole congregation of believers was united as one—one heart, one mind! They didn't even claim ownership of their own possessions. No one said, 'That's mine; you can't have it.' They shared everything. The apostles gave powerful witness to the resurrection of the Master Jesus, and grace was on all of them. And so it turned out that not a person among them was needy. Those who owned fields or houses sold them and brought the price of the sale to the apostles and made an offering of it. The apostles then distributed it according to each person's need. Joseph, called by the apostles "Barnabas" (which means "Son of Comfort"), a Levite born in Cyprus, sold a field that he owned, brought the money, and made an offering of it to the apostles" (Acts 4:32-37 The Message). It is interesting that Barnabas is listed by name after Luke tells of others in the church who owned fields and/or houses and sold them and brought the money to the apostles to distribute to the poor. We do not know the reason Barnabas is the only name mentioned of all who participated but it could have been because he was the first to take such action! Whether he was first or not, we know he was a selfless man, a word defined as, "concerned more with the needs and wishes of others than with one's own." Barnabas is a great model for every man to emulate. (To be continued).


The Principles of Prayer

"Now it came to pass, as He was praying in a certain place, when He ceased, that one of His disciples said to Him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples.' John taught his disciples to pray" (Luke 11:1, NKJV). Jesus taught His disciples to pray. Prayer is not something automatically learned. It is not something natural or effortless. You had to learn to walk and learn to talk, and you must learn to walk with God and talk to Him. Many people know a lot of information about prayer, but they never pray. It is not what you *know*, it's what you *do*. Warren Wiersbe said, "Prayer is the provision for every need and the solution to every problem." Jesus used what we know as "The Lord's Prayer" (Matthew 6 & Luke 11) to teach His disciples how to pray. I would like to note several principles of prayer:

- 1. The Place of Prayer "As He was praying in a certain place..." (Luke 11:1, NKJV). Jesus said, "But when you pray, go into your private room, shut your door, and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you." It is not wrong to pray in public, but we need to make sure that we have a private prayer life. What keeps a skyscraper from falling over when hit with fierce winds? It is the foundation deep down below, that no one sees, that gives it stability in the storm. Prayer should be the foundation of our life and is the key to surviving the storms of life. How you start your day affects everything in your day.
- 2. The Pattern of Prayer "In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:9-10). Jesus never said to pray these exact words. Jesus is not telling us *What* to pray but *How* to pray. It is an outline, a guide, a template, or a model. Jesus begins, "Our Father..." Prayer is relational. Only those who have put their faith in Jesus Christ can truly call God their Father. "Hallowed be Your name." We honor and respect His name. There is power in His name. God works for His name and not ours. If I pray for someone and they get healed, I don't take the credit. Likewise, if they don't get healed, I don't take the blame. "Your kingdom come. Your will be done." The purpose of prayer is not to get man's will done in heaven but to get God's will done on earth. Through prayer, we are to ask for three things: *Daily Bread* God wants us to depend upon Him daily. We cannot live on yesterday's blessing. We should not just pray from more things, but we should pray for more of Him. *Forgiveness of Sins* Sin separates us from one another and from God. We need to ask for forgiveness and choose to forgive others daily. *Protection from Temptation* We all face temptation every day. Even Jesus was tempted, but God has promised to make a way of escape (1 Corinthians 10:13).
- 3. The Persistence of Prayer In Luke 11, Jesus tells the story of a man trying to wake his neighbor at midnight because he needed something to eat. In those days, everyone lived in a one-bedroom home, maybe two rooms at the most. You don't want someone knocking on your door at midnight, especially if you have kids. The point is clear *persistence pays off*. If you can get a reluctant neighbor to give you what you need, how much more will your gracious heaven Father give you what you need. "So I say to you, ask, and it will be given to you. Seek, and you will find. Knock, and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened" (Luke 11:9-10, NKJV). These are all continuous verbs meaning to keep on asking, seeking, and knocking. We can't ask for something one time and presume we have it. Persistence gets results!
- 4. The Power of Prayer "Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly" (Matthew 6:16-18, NKJV). To be prayerless is to be powerless. I love the way Rick Dubose put it. He states, "Whoever controls the altar controls the outcome." Prayer and fasting takes our faith to a new level. Prayer connects us to God. Fasting disconnects us from the world. Prayer is lifting one hand to God and fasting is letting go with the other hand. Jesus did not say if you pray or fast, but when. Let's pray big because we serve a Big God!


